2. Lecture Topic

In this first module you will understand the tactics of Intensive Reading that the process of constructing meaning regarding various reading activities including (1) connecting between prior knowledge and messages in the text, (2) discovering the meaning of linguistic forms in the text and (3) construct the contents of the text in order to understand the texts read. In the process, you use prior knowledge to find topics, main points, text organization, linguistic forms used in order to find messages or intentional meanings. Therefore, it is recommended that you use a reading strategy that is suitable for the purpose and type of text being read.

The topic of the Incentive reading course is divided into 2 parts, namely the 1st part is the topic of lecture topics prior to the implementation of the Midterm Examination (UTS) and the 2nd part is the material of the lecture topics before the Final Semester Examination (UAS).

3. Reference Books and Assessment Components

Intensive Reading courses have lecture objectives that must be realized in one semester of study. The purpose of the lecture is that after completion of learning students are expected to be able to:

- Understand the basic concept of reading
- Getting general and specific information from the text, getting the main ideas and detailed information from the text, deducing the meaning of words, phrases and sentences based on the context
- Understand how to scanning and skimming text in the longer text
