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Definition of Narrative Text

 Narrative text is a text which contains story (fiction / nonfiction / tales / folktales / fables / myths / epic) and its plot consists of climax of the story (complication) then followed by the resolution

Purpose of Narrative Text

- A narrative text is a text amuse to entertain and deal with actual or vicarious experience in different ways.
- Narrative text deals with problematic events which leads to a crisis or turning point of some kind, which in turn finds a resolution.



The generic structure of narrative text

Orientation

It introduces the participant and the setting (where, when).

Complication

Resolution

Re-orientation

The crisis or problem arises.

The crisis is resolved for better or worse. It brings the sequence of events to an end.

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The closing sentence that tells the character's final condition in the story or the moral message of the story.



The Legend of Mount Batur

A long time ago, there lived on the island of Bali a giant-like creature named Kebo Iwo. The people of Bali used to say that Kebo Iwo was everything, a destroyer as well as a creator. He was satisfied with the meal, but this meant for the Balinese people enough food for a thousand men.

The mound of earth dug from the well by Kebo Iwo is known as Mount Batur.



The Difference Between Descriptive text and Narrative text

Introduction

In **descriptive writing**, the introduction is all about what the subject to be discussed in your writing. The reader can easily guess what is going to be the next. On the other hand, **the narrative writing** is based on suspense and writer does not reveal the story suddenly. In order to end up the mystery, the reader must go through from the paper.

Point of View

Descriptive writing is written with first person perspective. On the other hand, descriptive writing has third person point of view in it. Moreover, **narrative writing** includes place, person and object. On the other hand, in narrative writing, the writer talks about his/her personal experience.



Paragraph Structure

In **narrative writing**, you can write two sentences in one paragraph. However, **in descriptive one**, you can write long paragraphs. The use of **dialogues is quite common in narrative writing** in comparison to descriptive writing.

Conclusion

The ending part in descriptive writing can be short and to the point. However, in **narrative** essay the conclusion portion can be long and detailed one.

Overall Technique and Structure

If we talk about **narrative writing or essay**, then the events use to represent **in the chronological form**. There is a time frame in it. The writer uses the time feature to show different incidents to create a clear idea in reader's mind. On the other hand, in **descriptive writing**, you are **not bound to follow a strict time** frame to talk about any incident.
