Describing Data

- Descriptive statistics are numbers that are used to summarize and describe data.
- The word "data" refers to the information that has been collected from an experiment, a survey, a historical record, etc.
- (By the way, "data" is plural. One piece of information is called a "datum.")
- Any other number we choose to compute also counts as a descriptive statistic for the *data* from which the statistic is computed.




- Several descriptive statistics are often used at one time to give a full picture of the data.
- Descriptive statistics are very vital because it helps us in presenting data in a manner that can be easily visualized by people. This, therefore, means, the data can be easily absorbed by people.



Secondary School Attendance

	2000	2005	2009
Specialist Schools	12%	11%	10%

Read and analyze this!

To begin, the percentage of pupils in voluntary-controlled schools fell from just over half to only 20% or one fifth from 2000 to 2009. Similarly, the relative number of children in grammar schools - just under one quarter - dropped by half in the same period. As for the specialist schools, the relatively small percentage of pupils attending this type of school (12%) also fell, although not significantly.

However, while the other three types of school declined in importance, the opposite was true in the case of community schools. In fact, whereas only a small minority of 12% were educated in these schools in 2000, this figure increased to well over half of all pupils during the following nine years.
